## WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

## Liter<u>acy:</u>

Word Study - In January student will be introduced to new glued sounds (\_ng, \_nk). They will differentiate between a consonant blends and digraph blends. Lastly, students will be introduced to r-controlled vowel sounds. They will continue to learn and read high-frequency words in context.

There is a spelling test at the end of each week. Students are responsible for knowing previous weeks and current week words!! Parents are to sign and <u>return test on Monday.</u>

Reading Workshop - January theme: dinosaurs. Students will read information texts in search of answers to questions use text features when reading informational text and identify the main topic and retell details of a text.

Science: Animals. Students will learn how dinosaurs are alike and different.

Please continue to read daily with your child - encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words, retell the story in sequence and ask questions about the text. Encourage your child to read more non-fiction. These books can be about true events and real people or animals.

Writing Workshop - Writers will write a question and answer piece about dinosaurs.

#### Technology:

During the month of January, your child will be focusing on both keyboarding and mouse skills as well as proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed.

#### Math:

Module 2 - Introduction to Place Value Through Addition and Subtraction Within 20.

Topics include: Counting on or Taking from Ten to Solve Result Unknown and Total Unknown Problems, Strategies for Solving Change or Addend Unknown Problems, Varied Problems with Decompositions of Teen Numbers as 1 Ten and Some Ones.

Much of the new Common Core Math Curriculum focuses on math talk. When doing math homework have your child explain his steps and give reasons for what he does to solve the problem using the math vocabulary for the unit.

It is important that students start learning their math addition facts to 20 by rote. They should start by learning their doubles facts and ways to make 10 facts.

Continue working with your child recognizing their numbers up to 100.

## What's New in Performing Arts?

Ms. Eliot: Students will learn about the different instruments in an orchestra and explore the works of different composers. Ms. Granatelli (332): Happy New Year! During the month of

January 2020 students will focus on drawing and painting winter scenes.

Ms. LaGrotta (332): During dance class in January, first grade classes will be continuing identifying and demonstrating isolated dance moves of various body parts, locomotor and non-locomotor movements, and dancing with different tempos and rhythms.
