WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

<u>Literacy:</u>

Word Study – In May, we will study vowel digraphs and suffixes.

There is a spelling test at the end of each week. Students are responsible for knowing previous weeks and current week words. Parents are to sign and return test on Monday.

Reading Workshop- May theme: Dig Deeply into Complex Text. Readers will understand that characters in stories can convey important life lessons. Learners will explore content to understand that America is a strong country because of the diversity of its people.

Writers will understand that valid opinions are supported by reasons.

*Please continue to read daily with your child - encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words, retell the story in sequence (beginning, middle, end). Encourage them to ask questions and then discuss possible responses to their questions.

Students should be reading **20-30 minutes** each night (even if not written in homework).

Writing Workshop- students will formulate an opinion and support it with good reasons and text evidence.

Math:

Unit 10 continued – Developing understanding of linear measurement and measuring lengths as iterating length units. Domain: Measurement and Data, Represent Data

We will be working with analog clocks, please encourage your

child to tell time using an analog clock.

Unit 11- Reasoning about attributes of, and composing and decomposing geometric shapes.

Domain: Geometry

Technology:

Your child will continue practicing their keyboarding and mouse skills, typing, resources used for research, and proper use of the Internet. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed. In the month of May we will be focusing primarily on mouse and keyboarding skills.

What's New in Music and Art?

Ms. LaMorte: Students will learn 3 pieces with proper mallet techniques on Barred instruments (song and dance added), learn new piece, and work well with partners while singing properly.

Ms. Eliot: Students will revisit some favorite songs to review rhythms and movements with music.
