# WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

#### Literacy:

Word Study - In November, students will be introduced to the short vowel sounds and apply the concept that consonant and vowel sounds can be blended together to form words.

Each week new sight words and high frequency words will be introduced. There is a spelling test at the end of each week. Students are responsible for knowing previous weeks and current week words!!

Reading Workshop- November theme A: "Becoming a Classroom Citizen". Readers will retell stories, including key details and demonstrate understanding of their central message or lesson. Learners will explore content to understand how children contribute to a classroom community as "classroom citizens".

November theme B: "Becoming a Classroom Citizen," continued. Readers will identify a main topic and retell key details using the text and illustrations. Learners will explore content to understand how children contribute to a global community as "child citizens."

Please continue to read daily with your child – encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words, retell the story in sequence and ask questions about the text. Encourage your child to read more non-fiction. These books can be about true events and real people or animals.

**Social Studies** – November theme: Families, Now and Long Ago. Readers will read about life long ago and how families have a past and change over time.

#### Writing Workshop-

Module A: Writers will formulate opinion and supply reasons for the opinion.

Module B: Writers will create an explanatory text including facts about a topic and some closure.

In writing, students should continue to work on letter formation, using capitals and punctuations correctly, and finger spacing between words.

#### <u>Math:</u>

Unit 3 – Students will develop an understanding of addition, subtraction, and strategies for addition and subtraction within 20. Doman: Operations and Algebraic Thinking

## News/Information/Tips/Reminders

- Please sign your child's homework every night.
- Please check your child's red dot notebook for nightly homework and school notices.
- It is very important not to go ahead in workbooks as homework reflects work completed in class.
- Red folders, red dot notebooks, and math books should be returned to school everyday.
- Any notes/letters to your child's teacher should <u>not</u> be written in their red dot notebook. Please write on a separate paper.
- Please be aware that in first grade students are responsible for unpacking/packing their supplies. Encourage your child to unpack their red folders, red dot notebooks and math book. Discuss what homework is assigned for the evening.
- You and your child should be reading for 20 minutes each night.
- Dress your child appropriately for the weather. Keeping in mind that our classrooms gets warm, but that it is getting cooler outside, layering works best.
- As always, please label your child's clothing and lunch boxes so they can be returned in case they get misplaced.
- Remember you have Think Central as resources for your child.
  This is a valuable tool when your child forgets their math book
  in school or is absent from school. It also contains additional
  resources you're your child can participate in.
