WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

<u>Literacy:</u>

Word Study - In October we will be continue reviewing the consonants and short vowels. Students will begin to understand and learn to apply the concept that consonant and vowel sounds can be blended together to form words. Each week new sight words and high frequency words will be introduced. Students will be tested weekly on these words. They are responsible for new and previous weeks' words.

Reading Workshop- October theme: "Connecting to Our World". Readers will read informational texts in search of answers to questions.

Social Studies content taught through literacy. Learners will explore a variety of informational texts while asking and answering questions. This month's unit focus is families.

*Please continue to read daily with your child – encourage him/her to use print strategies to figure out difficult words. Encourage them to retell the beginning, middle and end of their story.

Writer's Workshop - Writers will create one informational piece on a topic.

In writing, students should be working on forming their letters properly and using proper writing conventions, including capitals, ending punctuation and finger spacing between words.

Math:

Students will make progress towards fluency with addition and subtraction of numbers to 10 with opportunities to advance them from counting all to counting on, then to decomposing and composing numbers and total amounts.
