WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

English Language Arts:

In January, students will be immersed in literature, reading fictional stories such as A Chair for My Mother, City Green and Charlotte's Web. Our focus skill is to summarize portions of a text, retelling important ideas, and identifying the central message. We will also be analyzing how characters respond to major challenges, identifying words and phrases that appeal to the senses and suggest feelings, and 'reading' illustrations.

Word Work:

January's Word Work will build on previous skills learned as well study the rules that make long vowel sounds. We will continue to build on sight words and apply prior spelling patterns into independent writing.

Writing:

This month's writing goal is for students to stay on point and continue using spelling patterns learned to help with more challenging words. Students will learn the components of opinion writing and publish a piece in which they will express their thoughts and feelings about a subject matter presented.

Math:

Module 4: Addition and Subtraction Within 200 with Word Problems to 100

Students will build on what they know about place value and apply strategies, such as using math drawings and manipulatives, to fluently add and subtract within 100 and solve one- and two-step word problems.

Focus standards are:

2.OA.1 Use addition and subtraction within 100 to solve oneand two-step word problems involving situations of adding to, taking from, putting together, taking apart, and comparing, with unknowns in all positions.

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{2.NBT.5}}$ Fluently add and subtract within 100 using strategies based on place value

2.NBT.6 Add using strategies based on place value and properties of operations.

2.NBT.7 Add and subtract within 1000, using concrete models or drawings and strategies based on place value, properties of operations, and/or the relationship between addition and subtraction; relate the strategy to a written method.

2.NBT.8 Mentally add 10 or 100 to a given number 100-900, and mentally subtract 10 or 100 from a given number 100-900.
2.NBT.9 Explain why addition and subtraction strategies work, using place value and the properties of operations.

(Explanations may be supported by drawings or objects.)

Technology:

During the month of January, your child will be focusing their navigation skills using their prior practice of keyboarding and mouse expertise, along with proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed.

Science:

Physical Science continues to be our focus. In January we will be learning what objects are made of, and how matter can change. We will be relating our study to real word experiences and looking at careers that lend itself to these ideas.

Social Studies:

Students will be learning about location (absolute and relative). We will be focusing on identifying where something/someone is located using a map, grid map and description. Students are going to learn the reason we use a map and are also going to use the different parts of a map. We will also be learning about the Earth. We will focus on locating the oceans, continents, and different hemispheres on different maps of the world.

What's New in Performing Arts?

Ms. Granatelli: Happy New Year! During the month of *January 2020* students will focus on drawing and painting winter scenes.

Ms. LaGrotta (332): During dance class in January, second grade classes will be continuing identifying and demonstrating isolated dance moves of various body parts, locomotor and non-locomotor movements, and dancing with different tempos and rhythms.
