# WHAT ARE WE STUDYING? English Language Arts:

We are gearing our minds toward informational text and our theme is *Explorations*! November's focus skills and standards include: identifying the central idea and point of view, retelling and summarizing key details in a text, and developing and answering questions to demonstrate understanding.

#### Word Work:

November's Word Work skills' focus will include diagraphs and blending, as well as building on sight words and transferring prior spelling patterns into independent writing.

#### Writing:

This month's writing goal is to write an informational piece. Students will learn the craft of bookmaking by using nonfiction text features to help tell what they learned. We will continue to practice using correct grammar, spelling and punctuation.

#### Math:

Module 3: Addition and Subtraction of Length Units
In this unit, students expand their skills with understanding of
units by bundling ones, tens and hundreds up to a thousand. It
also includes counting by ones, tens and hundreds as 10 ones are
renamed as 1 ten, etc. The goal is for students to move back
and forth fluidly between these models.

Focus standards practiced are:

2.NBT.1 Understand that three digits of a three-digit number represent amounts of hundreds, tens and ones.

2.NBT.2 Count within 1,000, skip-count by 5s, 10s and 100s.

**2.NBT.3** Read and write numbers to 1,000 using base-ten numerals, number names and expanded form.

**2.NBT.4** Compare two three-digit numbers based on meanings of the hundreds, tens and ones digits, using symbols to record the results of comparisons.

### Technology:

During the month of November, your child will be focusing their navigation skills using their prior practice of keyboarding and mouse expertise, along with proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed.

#### Science:

This month's Science topic highlights an introduction to physical science. Students will think like scientists as they are introduced to new vocabulary and understand the basics of matter and space.

We will be learning about their local, state, and U.S. government. We will learn about the people who make up the different branches of government.
