WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Literacy:

Reading -

Although all of our learning up until this point supports the Common Core, we are continuing our test preparation for the upcoming ELA statewide test. Using various materials, we will review all of the skills that the children will be exposed to on the upcoming exam. We will also continue our focus on reading complex texts.

Writing – We will continue to expand on our thoughts about the texts we have read to prepare the students to properly answer the short and extended response questions. The students need to use textual evidence to help them respond to both types of questions.

Vocabulary – Students will be using Wordly Wise in class. They will be assessed on their words each Friday.

Math

The students will continue working in Module 5 of Eureka Math. Students will extend and deepen their knowledge of fractions as numbers on the number line. They will practice with equal shares to understanding fractions as equal partitions of a whole.

Social Studies:

The students will begin to study Brazil this month and how culture, history, geography, people, and government affect communities in Brazil.

Science:

The students will continue to learn about living things.

Technology:

During the month of March, your child will be focusing their navigation skills using their prior practice of keyboarding and mouse expertise, along with proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed. We will also be continuing to learn about Microsoft Word and how to find information about a topic using online resources.

What's New in Performing Arts?

Mr. Cintula: 3rd Grade General Music is moving forward in Unit 1: Lesson 3 "Rhythm Around The House". The main concept is: Rhythm.

Our goal is to be able to read a rhythm pattern of quarter notes, eighth notes and quarter note rests as well as play obstinate patterns on our Orff Instruments. Links to social studies will be included. Some featured songs will be: Great Big House, Sweet Potatoes, My Friend Tom, Rain is Falling Down.

Ms. Eliot: Class 322 is continuing to learn the different sounds of each instrument and how sound is produced. We will continue with each instrument family to learn what they look and sound like.

Ms. Granatelli: During the month of *March* students in class 320 will continue exploring "collage" techniques.

Ms. LaGrotta (333): During dance class in March, third grade classes will be continuing identifying and demonstrating isolated dance moves of various body parts, locomotor and non-locomotor movements, and dancing with different tempos and rhythms.
