WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Literacy:

Reading - It's all about non-fiction!

The students will understand main ideas by looking closely at the facts and details used to support them. They will also be able to identify comparisons, contrasts, and changes over time by closely reading sentences, paragraphs, and text features across texts about the same topic.

Word Study - The students will continue to practice various spelling patterns each week in class.

Writing - Our 3rd grade writers will be writing an informational piece. By the end of the unit, they will be able to use research-based facts and text features to convey main ideas and details about a topic that changes over time.

Vocabulary - Each week the students will receive vocabulary words that relate to our unit of study. They will be assessed on those words each Friday.

Math: Multiply! Multiply! Multiply!

This month is all about multiplication. The following concepts will be covered during chapters 3 and 4: associative, distributive, and commutative properties of multiplication, multiplying with 0-12 times tables, and problem solving involving multiplication.

Social Studies:

The students will continue studying world geography and culture through the use of primary sources.

Science:

The students will be studying how to define a problem and how to design a solution to their problem.

Technology:

During the month of November, your child will be focusing their navigation skills using their prior practice of keyboarding and mouse expertise, along with proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed. We will also be continuing to learn about Microsoft Word and how to find information about a topic using online resources.

What's New in Music and Art?

Ms. Granatelli: During the month of November students will create a work of art using collage techniques.

Mr. Cintula: We are continuing our journey of folk music around the world through our textbook series "The Music Connection", grade 3. We will be singing together and solo as well as sample percussion instruments and techniques on various songs.

Ms. LaMorte: Students will continue study of soprano recorder, secure new note G and coordinate with B and A in 2 new pieces, and learn/apply crossover bordun accompaniment with Barred Instruments to recorder piece.
