


The Fantastic Fourth Grade

WHAT ARE WE STUDYING? Literacy:

We will be beginning our narrative unit of study. We will be reading our second novel. Students are going to be working on character analysis. Our focus is going to be identifying how characters overcome obstacles.

Math

We will continue to prepare for the upcoming state tests. We are continuing to learn strategies to solve word problems. Also, we are working on building strong explanations to support mathematical thinking. Students will also be visiting chapters 11 and 13. Chapter 11 focuses on identifying and measuring different types of angles. Chapter 13 will focus on applying the area and perimeter formulas for rectangles in real world and mathematical problems.

Social Studies:

Students will continue their study of the colonial rebellion against the British. Students will understand that the colonists' objections to British rule helped shape the government that the United States has today. We will also emphasize New York's importance during the American Revolution.

Science:

This month the students will be practicing for the Science Statewide Exam, which will be administered in June. Some of the topics to be reviewed include forces in motion and gravity.

What's New in Music and Art?

Mr. Cintula: We are continuing to work on folk music from around the world in our 4th grade level book.

Ms. LaMorte: Students will perform new trimester necessities, including music assessment, learn new piece with dance and concentric aides, and learn proper singing technique.

Ms. Granatelli: During the month of April students begin their final performing arts rotation. Their first creative project will be drawing and painting a self-portrait.
