# WHAT ARE WE STUDYING? Literacy:

We are beginning test preparation for the upcoming NYS examination. Students will be working in class and at home in their Common Core aligned Test Ready booklets and ELA packets. We will be reviewing test strategies, rubrics, and writing responses to select prompts. We strongly recommend students utilize their iReady accounts at home. Students are able to complete lessons, games, and practice problems in reading and math.

#### Math:

We will be moving into Chapter 8 of the Go Math program. Students will learn to write fractions as the products of a whole number and a unit fraction. They will use models and diagrams to multiply a fraction by a whole number.

Also, test preparation for the upcoming state examinations will begin for math. Students will be working in class and at home in their Performance Task books. Students will also be revisiting concepts and completing additional practice.

#### Social Studies:

Unit 3 will examine the effects of the American Revolution on the people of New York. The students will learn about Colonists' response to British rule. We will also learn about the role New York played in the Revolution.

#### Science:

This month the curriculum will include different forms of energy. Students will be working in the science lab and reviewing concepts in class from their Science Coach Book. Topics that will be covered include; heat, temperature, electrical currents, and energy changing form.

## What's New in Music and Art?

**Mr. Cintula:** We are working on a favorite pop song "This Is Me" from the movie <u>The Greatest Showman</u>. We are also working on folk songs about accepting each other and counting on good friends.

**Ms. LaMorte:** Students will learn new notes Low D and High C on recorder with 2 new pieces and possibly learn 2 new dances. **Ms. Granatelli:** During the month of March, students continue their sewing project.

## Technology:

During the month of March, your child will be focusing on both keyboarding and mouse skills, as well as proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools and a Typing Software Program to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed. We will also be continuing to learn about Microsoft Word and how to find information about a topic using online resources.
