WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Literacy:

Reading – We are working on test preparation for the upcoming NYS examination. Students will be working in class and at home in their Common Core aligned Test booklets and ELA packets. We will be reviewing test strategies, rubrics, and writing responses to select prompts.

We will also be analyzing persuasive texts and providing text evidence to support our perspectives on various topics.

Writing - Students will be forming short and extended responses in response to reading passages while preparing for the upcoming state test. Students must provide a claim and details to support their answer; for extended responses, students will add an introduction and conclusion.

Students will begin to develop their opinion writing based on the pros and cons of a topic, providing text evidence to support their interpretation.

Math:

We are continuing Module 5, developing our understanding of fractions. We will focus on fraction equivalence, addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators, and multiplication of fractions by whole numbers. Students will be working on using models and multiplication to generate equivalent fractions. We will also be working on writing fractions in their simplest form. The unit will also include comparing fractions by first writing them as fractions with a common numerator or denominator.

Students will also be visiting Modules 4 and 7. Module 4 focuses on identifying and measuring different types of angles. Module 7 consists of measurement.

We are also engaged in test preparation for the upcoming state examination. Students will be working in class and at home in their booklets and packets. Students will also be revisiting previous concepts and completing additional practice.

Science:

Students will learn about magnetism and electricity.

Social Studies:

Students will continue their study of the colonial rebellion against the British. Students will understand that the colonists' objections to British rule helped shape the government that the United States has today. We will also emphasize New York's importance during the American Revolution.



What's New in Performing Arts?

Mr. Cintula: 4th Grade General Music is moving forward in Unit 1: 3 "Rhythm, round, Fun!""

Objective: Perform from notation rhythm patterns containing quarter notes, two beamed eighth notes, half notes, and quarter rests.

Skills: Read, Play, Sing. Curriculum Links: Mathematics

Ms. Eliot: Class 422 is continuing to learn the different sounds of each instrument and how sound is produced. We will continue with each instrument family to learn what they look and sound like.
