WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

<u>Literacy:</u>

Reading – We are going to be continuing reading the book **Wonder** by RJ Palacio. The students are going to be working on identifying themes throughout the story. Students will also be analyzing the characters throughout the novel. They will be collecting text evidence to support their thesis claims.

Writing - Writers will be completing literary essays based on character traits and themes identified in **Wonder**. Students will be working within small groups to locate supportive evidence for their essays. The groups will be recording their evidence and focusing in on specific scenes and dialogue in the book.

<u>Math:</u>

Our current chapter focuses multiplying 2-digit numbers using different strategies. Students will work on using the four operations with whole numbers to solve problems. Students will also work using place value understanding and properties of operations to perform multi-digit arithmetic.

Social Studies:

Students will be learning about the early Native American settlements in New York. They will be learning about the different Native American groups that lived in different parts of New York and about the effects of the geography of New York on the first people who lived there.

<u>Science</u>

- Students will be studying the following topics:
- 1. The processes that make up the water cycle.
- 2. Why soil is important, weathering, and erosion.

What's New in Music and Art?

Mr. Cintula: We are continuing our journey of folk music around the world through our textbook series "The Music Connection", grade 4. We will be singing together and solo as well as sample percussion instruments and techniques on various songs.

Ms. LaMorte: Students will continue study of soprano recorder, secure notes B, A, G, and E, learn new note D with new piece, learn piece for Thanksgiving using the Barred Instruments, and learn proper mallet technique. **Ms. Granatelli**: During the month of November students will explore the art technique of "collage."
