WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

<u>Literacy:</u>

Reading – We will begin reading the book, <u>Wonder</u> by R.J. Palacio. Our reading will not only highlight the important message emphasized throughout the book, it will also be guided by our focus standards. Students will be reading and responding to specific literature standards throughout their reading. They will be completing standard based tasks in response to <u>Wonder</u>. **Writing** – We will continue to construct literary essays in response to literature. Students will be working on identifying theme, traits, and character change throughout selected texts. Students will then respond to standard aligned tasks regarding their reading comprehension. Students will also be comparing common themes, trends, and characters across different texts through essay.

Math:

We'll be wrapping up Module 1 where students are working with whole numbers and applying them in single and multi step word problems. We have been developing our understanding up to millions by using the place value chart and recognizing the pattern of times ten. Students will continue writing digits in numerous forms, as well as rounding, comparing, adding and subtracting.

We will begin Module 2, which uses length, mass and capacity in the metric system to convert between units using place value. Conversions will be applied in single and multi step word problems.

Science:

Students will explore force and motion. They will use science tools to measure force, and discover how simple machines work by reducing the amount of force needed. They will crank gears, decrease friction and investigate tools to identify what makes them labor-saving devices.

Social Studies:

Students will be learning about the early colonists in the New York region and the reasoning behind the colonists' journey to the new land. Students will also be learning about the challenges the colonists faced. They will also explore the first governments that were created amongst the colonies.
