WHAT ARE WE STUDYING? Literacy:

Reading - We are going to be finishing the book <u>Wonder</u> by RJ Palacio. The students will continue to work on identifying themes and supportive evidence for their literacy essay. Students are gathering evidence by closely analyzing the characters and text. This evidence will be used to support the claim they select from their collection of themes throughout the text.

Writing – Writers will be completing their literary essays based on the themes they have identified in the novel <u>Wonder</u>. Students will be continuing their work within small teams to closely read and interpret specific moments in the text. Students will continue to locate supportive evidence for their essays. The groups will be recording their evidence and focusing in on specific scenes and dialogue in the book.

<u>Math:</u>

We will begin working on Chapter 5 of the Go Math curriculum this month. Students will be working on determining factors and multiples, and how to generate and describe number patterns. Students will use models and arrays to determine products.

<u>Social Studies:</u>

We are beginning the second unit of our Social Studies curriculum. Students will be studying how the exploration and settlement of the New York area led to interaction among diverse peoples. Students will learn how the arrival of Europeans in New York affected the ways of life of Native Americans there.

<u>Science</u>

Students will be:

1. Measuring forces using a spring scale.

2. Studying the kinds of forces, such as gravity and friction.

3. Experimenting with simple machines, such as the lever, pulley, inclined plane, screw and wheel and axle.

<u>Technology:</u>

During the month of December, your child will be focusing on both keyboarding and mouse skills, as well as proper use of the Internet. We will be using online tools and a Typing Software Program to help maximize these skills. Along the way, we will work on integrating their literacy and mathematical skills, ensuring that all our students maximize their learning with hands on opportunities to succeed. We will also be continuing to learn about Microsoft Word and how to find information about a topic using online resources.

What's New in Music and Art?

Mr. Cintula: We have ended our songs of thankfulness with a harvest folk song and are beginning our winter themed pieces in our Music Connection text. These pieces work on basic harmony singing and changes in meter.
Ms. LaMorte: Students will learn line dance and Heel and Toe Polka and discuss/apply "What Would the World Be Like Without Music?" in new piece. If time, students will also learn recorder piece with new note High D and familiar notes B, A, G, E, D and High C, learn 11 songs with motions, and self-evaluate.

Ms. Granatelli: During the month of December students will be exploring sculpturing with modeling clay.
