WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Reading

We will continue reading non-fiction books about animal homes and animals. Students will read our level A and B nonfiction animal readers to identify pieces of information in a text. (KR2) Students will be using our Reading Super Powers such as Pointer Power, Picture Power and Pattern Power to advance their reading levels. The information learned will then be used to help continue to write nonfiction books about animals.

Writing

We will continue to use a combination of drawing, dictating, oral expression, and/or emergent writing to name a familiar topic and supply information. KW2 We will add details to our writing by using pictures and words by labeling our pictures. We will begin to write simple sentences to add to our animal fact books. When doing writing homework with your child, encourage them to listen for the first sound in a word and match the letter to the sound. This is the first step in labeling a picture. Practice reading and writing sight words with your child. These words are important tools for the beginning reader.

Math

We will begin Module 2 in the Eureka Math program. Our young learners will seek out and describe flat or twodimensional and solid or three- dimensional shapes in their environment. Students will have repeated practice with shapes, their attributes and their names. Students will also be comparing similarities and differences of two and three – dimensional shapes. Students will continue to work extensively with numbers to 10 and fluency with addition and subtraction to 5.



Dance with Ms. LaGrotta

During dance class in December, Kindergarten classes will be continuing identifying and demonstrating isolated dance moves of various body parts, locomotor and non-locomotor movements, and dancing with different tempos and rhythms.
