WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Reading

We will read nonfiction how to books. The books we will read are, *Let's Find Out About Ice Cream* by Mary Ebeltoft Reid, How *to Draw Wild Animals* by Christine Smith and *Learning to Swim* by Donna Bailey.

We will follow the step-by-step directions and chart how to make ice cream, draw an animal and learn how to swim. Readers will identify the steps to learn how to do different things.

Writing

We will use pictures and words to write how to books. We will write step by step instructions to tell how to dissect a lima bean seed, draw a flower and other things kindergarten children know how to do. We will continue to write complete sentences to add to our writing. We will use a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence and a period at the end. Please encourage your children to use sight words in their sentences and the mini word wall sent home as a tool for writing. Students should make sure their sentence matches what the picture portrays. When doing writing homework with your child, encourage them to stretch their words and write the sounds they hear. Continue labeling their pictures. Practice reading and writing sight words with your child. These words are important tools for the beginning reader.

Math

We will be finishing Chapter 12 this month. Chapter 12 looks at measurement and data. We will be classifying objects and count the number of objects in each category. This is the last math unit for the year.

What's New in Music and Art?

Ms. LaMorte: Students will complete songs for K-celebration, learn/secure 5 dances, identify/apply lines and spaces of music staff, and discuss/apply leadership in a group activity.

Ms. Eliot: Students will continue to learn rhythms and movements to some of their favorite songs.
