### WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

#### Reading

This month we will be reading non-fiction and fiction books about animal homes. They are *A Bed For Winter*, by Karen Wallace, *Hibernation Station*, by Kurt Cyrus, *Life on a Pond*, by Carol K. Lindeen and *In the Small Small Pond*, by Denise Flemming.

We will be focusing on the Next Generation Standards in reading and writing. Readers will develop and answer questions about a text. KR1 Readers will retell stories or share key details from a text. KR2 Readers will identify characters, setting, major events in a story, or pieces of information in a text. RK3 We will be looking at text features of a non-fiction text such as the table of contents, headings and glossary. We will also be comparing two different texts.

#### Writing

We will be using a combination of drawing, dictating, oral expression, and/or emergent writing to name a familiar topic and supply information. KW2 We will add details to our writing by using pictures and words by labeling our pictures. When doing writing homework with your child, encourage them to listen for the first sound in a word and match the letter to the sound. This is the first step in labeling a picture. We will begin writing simple sentences. Practice reading and writing sight words with your child. These words are important tools for the beginning reader.

#### Math

We will continue working on Module 1 in our new Math program, **Eureka**. Our young learners are classifying, counting and sorting objects into given categories. We will also be writing, counting and decomposing numbers to 10, concentrating on the numbers 6 to 10.



#### Dance with Ms. LaGrotta

During dance class in November, Kindergarten classes will be continuing identifying and demonstrating isolated dance moves of various body parts, locomotor and non-locomotor movements, and dancing with different tempos and rhythms. We will begin working on our alphabet unit, which allows the students to be creative and make the letters of the alphabet with their body!
