WHAT ARE WE STUDYING?

Reading

We will read nonfiction books about life cycles. The books we will read are, *Sunflower Life Cycle* and **Butterfly Life Cycle**, both by Jeff Bauer, and Frog Life Cycle, by Justin McCory Martin. We will be comparing these books to fiction books that touch on the same subject. These books are *The Tiny Seed* and *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*, both by Eric Carle, and *From Tadpole to Frog*, by Wendy Pfeefer.

We will look at the main idea and key details in a nonfiction text, new vocabulary words associated with life cycles and different text features of a non-fiction text. Readers will identify similarities and differences between two texts on the same topic. Learners will explore content to tell how different living things change through a life cycle.

<u>Writing</u>

We will use pictures and words to tell about the main idea and supporting details of a topic. We will write about information found in a nonfiction book. We will write sentences comparing two texts. We will continue to write complete sentences to add to our writing. We will use a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence and a period at the end. Please encourage your children to use sight words in their sentences and the mini word wall sent home as a tool for writing. Students should make sure their sentence matches what the picture portrays. When doing writing homework with your child, encourage them to stretch their words and write the sounds they hear. Continue labeling their pictures. Practice reading and writing sight words with your child. These words are important tools for the beginning reader.

<u>Math</u>

We will be working on Chapter 10 this month. In this chapter we will be identifying and describing threedimensional shapes. We will be looking at which shapes can roll or stack. We will also be looking at position words like above, behind, below, beside, next to and in front of. We will then begin Chapter 11. We will be comparing and measuring objects and analyzing data.
